While 1941 was a big year for women's extension clubs, the 4-H club enrollment continued to decline. Membership dropped a full one hundred from the previous year. Nine active clubs consisted of 106 boys and girls.

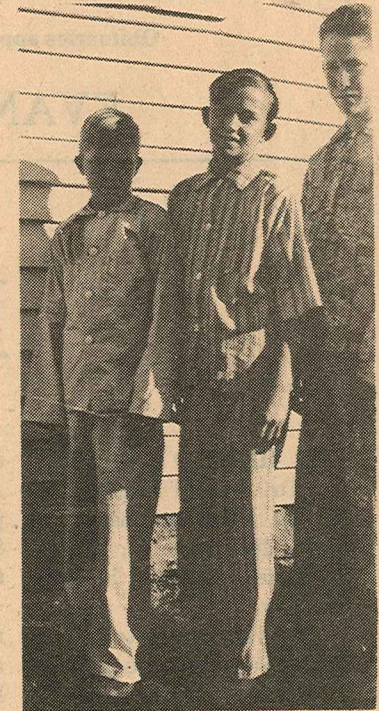
