



## MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 12/30/21

Finally starting to feel more like winter, and it sounds as if a major cold front is coming for the weekend. Forecast of snow and sleet could be significant for the northern half of the state, along with wind chills below zero is not quite the start of the New Year anyone wants. Rains for much of the state even has some areas talking about mud for the first time in a long time, as the ground has yet to freeze thus far. Feeding has picked up quite a bit over the last week, as most producers have used up the last of any stockpiled pastures. A few more hay inquires with the projection of some winter weather, but for the most part, business is still made up of mostly equine interest. The supply of hay is moderate and demand is light to moderate and prices mostly steady.
