


Compared to last week, feeders sold unevenly steady. There were spots across the board both a few dollars lower and a few dollars higher without out much rhyme or reason to weights or the day of the week. The supply of feeders was light to moderate, and demand was moderate to good. Given the ups and downs of the futures markets due to news and rumors about avian flu virus, some of which proved true while other parts didn't, prices at the local auctions held together very well for the week. Given that prices have been at or near record levels rumors are more than enough to cause some nervousness and sometimes move markets significantly. Local auctions were about the only bright spot this week as fed cattle, boxed beef, and futures all ended the week much lower. A few notable sales this week included a load of 417 lb. steers with thin flesh at Kingsville Livestock Market which sold for 394.00. A part load of 511 lb. steers at Joplin Regional Stockyards sold for 350.00. A part load of 714 lbs. steers at Green City Livestock Market sold for 284.50. Joplin Regional Stockyards also sold two loads of 801 lb. steers at 259.75. A couple of notable heifer sales included a load of 501 lb. heifers at Callaway Livestock Center which sold for 310.00 and a load of 703 lb. heifers at Lolli Brothers Livestock Market which brought 257.75. Boxed beef cutouts values were sharply lower for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 297.17, down 9.05 and select closed at 294.70, down 8.73 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled about 75K head prices levels were lower this week. Live sales were reported at 183.00-187.00 and Dressed sales at 296.00-297.00. 





MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

There were 5.3 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending March 31, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 50.7 degrees, 1.9 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.02 inches, 0.03 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent very short, 31 percent short, and 64 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 11 percent very short, 36 percent short, and 53 percent adequate. Corn planted reached 2 percent. Soybeans planted reached 1 percent. Winter wheat condition was 1 percent poor, 22 percent fair, 66 percent good, and 11 percent excellent.

GRAIN CRUSH AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 492 million bushels in February 2024. Total corn consumption was up 2 percent from January 2024 and up 11 percent from February 2023. February 2024 usage included 92.1 percent for alcohol and 7.9 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 4.54 million bushels, up 13 percent from January 2024 and up 35 percent from February 2023. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 442 million bushels, was up less than 1 percent from January 2024 and up 11 percent from February 2023. Corn consumed in February 2024 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 92.4 percent and 7.6 percent, respectively.

Dry mill co-product production of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.81 million tons during February 2024, up 3 percent from January 2024 and up 16 percent from February 2023. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.17 million tons in February 2024, down 10 percent from January 2024 but up 1 percent from February 2023

Wet mill corn gluten feed production was 254,386 tons during February 2024, up 13 percent from January 2024 and up 3 percent from February 2023. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was 207,421 tons in February 2024, up 4 percent from January 2024 and up 12 percent from February 2023.

OILSEED CRUSH, PRODUCTION, CONSUMPTION, STOCKS

Sovbeans crushed for crude oil was 5.82 million tons (194 million bushels) in February 2024, compared with 5.84 million tons (195 million bushels) in January 2024 and 5.31 million tons (177 million bushels) in January 2024 and 5.31 million tons (177 million bushels) bushels) in February 2023. Crude oil produced was 2.29 billion pounds, up less than 1 percent from January 2024 and up 10 percent from February 2023. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.63 billion pounds during February 2024 increased 2 percent from January 2024 increased 2 perce ary 2024 but decreased 2 percent from February 2023.

As we officially get a bit into Spring the weather has been extremely volatile. Some severe weather this week which did cause some damage in a few locations with wind, hail and heavy rains. A few areas reported some flurries to a light dusting of snow. The cold snaps lately have slowed what seemed a month ago to be a very early growing season. Hay interest continues to slowly decrease as turnout draws closer each day. There is still demand and movement occurring just at a bit slower pace. The supply of hay is light to moderate; demand is moderate, prices are steady to weak.
